Governance and management

Aberdour Climate Action Network (ACAN) was recognised as a Scottish Charity by OSCR on 23 March 2023. Prior to that date it was an informal group. For governance and planning it meets on a monthly basis with meetings attended by both committee members and wider volunteers.

- empowering and increasing the resilience of individuals to enable them to take action to tackle climate change by undertaking education, community activities, support for carbon reduction, campaigning, and carrying out direct carbon reduction activities

Summary of the main achievements during the period

Awareness Raising and Promoting Action

Various activities were held in the village including taking part in the Aberdour Festival. We continued to show climate action films funded by the Fife Climate Action Network.

Household energy efficiency and renewables

The decision was made not to proceed with a group purchasing scheme for heat pumps supported by Local Energy Scotland since it was considered that the resources available were not sufficient. Small scale demonstrations have continued promoting energy efficiency and the installation of zero carbon heating.

Biodiversity

A group of volunteers met on a fortnightly basis to carry out practical activity around the village to promote biodiversity.
