Basis of independent examiner's statement

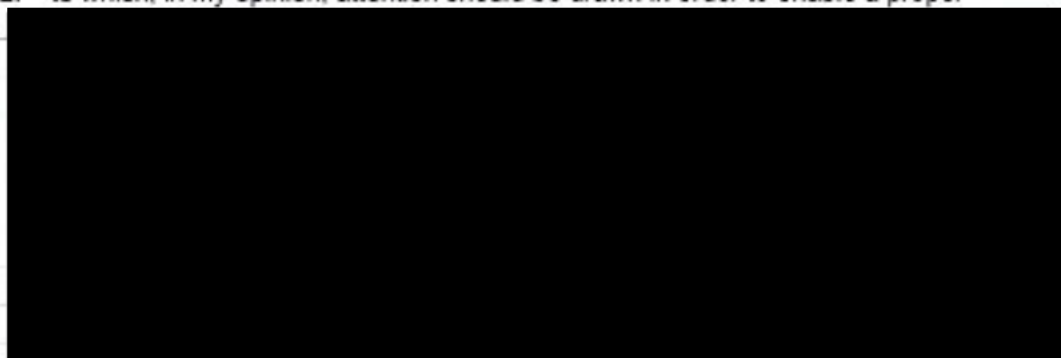
