The trustees present their report and the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025.

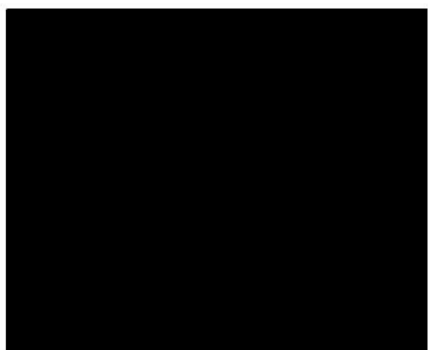

### Governing Document

Salvesen Community Football Club is a single-tier SCIO (Scottish Chartered Incorporated Organisation) and was registered with OSCR as a charity on 15 August 2023. The SCIO is established under its Constitution, dated 15 August 2023, which set out its structure, its charitable purposes and powers.

### Recruitment, Appointment, Role and Responsibilities of the SCIO Board

The members of the SCIO Board are the charity trustees for the purposes of charity law. The Board may appoint any person to be a charity trustee by way of a majority vote at a Board meeting. At each Annual

General Meeting (AGM), any trustees appointed during the period since the preceding AGM (but excluding any reappointed in the period) and one third of the remaining trustees shall retire from office,

selected as being those who have been in office longest since they were last appointed or re-appointed. A retiring trustee will be eligible for re-appointment at the next Board Meeting.

Each trustee has a duty, in exercising functions as a trustee, to act in the interests of the organization.

### **Objects of the Charity**

The objects of the Salvesen Community Football Club SCIO are to increase participation of young people in sport and physical activity.

The club was founded in 1953 and has been offering football to children from the local community for almost 70 years. Due to the re-development of Forresters/St Augustines's schools, the Salvesen clubrooms on the historic school campus were demolished which has resulted in the club's football activity being spread over four different venues.

Charitable status is the first step in Salvesen Community Football Club SCIO's ambition to re-establish a single site where all training and matches can take place, re-establish our position in the community and create a first class facility for current and future players. It will allow hundreds and adults, aged 2-75 to play sport on a regular weekly basis.

With the re-established Salvesen Hub, it will create citizenship and community and provide a welcoming space for local community groups to use alongside the football club. Working in partnership with local agencies and organisations, the club will create opportunities for the wider community who will benefit from walking clubs, youth clubs and the new Salvesen refugee football team.

Through our sporting programmes, we will provide volunteering, work experience and employment opportunities for young people. In partnership with Forresters High School, we hope to start an Alternative Schools programme for teenagers struggling to attend school and help them re-engage positively.

The charity will initially target the provision of sporting opportunities for young people, many of whom face a lack of both positive opportunities and sense of identity. However, in the medium to long term, Salvesen Community Football Club SCIO will also the a community facility which will sit in the heart of the community, providing opportunities and benefits for all ages and abilities.

### **Achievements and Performance**

Salvesen Community Football Club SCIO are in the process of growing back to the size and status of the club prior to the re-development of the Forresters/St Augustine's campus and the loss of our clubhouse and facilities. From the new project inception, Salvesen Community Football Club is now over 300 strong and continues to increase regularly.

## **Trustees' Report (continued)**

### **Financial Review**

The results for the year are set out on pages 7 to 11.

The charity's second financial accounting period covers the full year to 31 March 2025 and that fact limits the usefulness of comparisons with its first accounting period as a SCIO from 15 August 2023 to 31 March 2024. The year to 31 March 2025 showed an overall surplus of £1,116 (2024- £24,872). This comprised a surplus on unrestricted funds of £12,325 (2024-£16,734) and a deficit on restricted funds of £11,209 (2024-Surplus £8,138). It is also worth noting that the first accounting period to 31 March 2024 benefitted from the transfer of £22,968 of funds from the Salvesen Community Football Club prior to its establishment as a SCIO.

In terms of restricted funds, the receipts and payments in the year to 31 March 2025 produced a deficit of £11,209 (2024- Surplus of £8,138). This outcome means that there is an overall deficit of £3,071 on restricted funds as at 31 March 2025 – which is being supported by the cumulative surplus of £29,059 on unrestricted funds.


Match fees received from all players amounted to £85,892 (2024-£41,395) and these were sufficient to cover the match-related costs of £78,370 (2024-£35,553). As well as the investment in coaching fees of £8,534 (2024-£7,610), a further £4,765 (2024-£12,927) was committed to the purchase of new strips and other football equipment.

### **Plans for future periods**

Salvesen Community Football Club SCIO plans to show how facilities can be developed and managed by a local grassroots sports club working in collaboration with schools, local authorities, funding bodies and local communities. By doing this first phase, we will have gained a base to call home to facilitate the growth of the club and further our objectives in the community.

Our proposal would see new, modern investment in sporting facilities, combined with a new community asset, that will help create a legacy impact for physical activity and many other social and community outcomes for decades to come.


