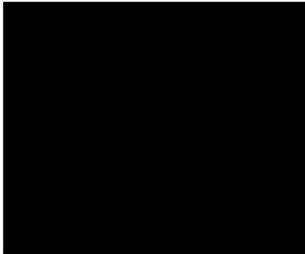

Recruitment and appointment of Trustees

- (iii) Up to 3 individual person co-opted so as to ensure a spread of skills and experience within the Board.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

South Skye Community Campus was set up to develop, manage and facilitate sport and recreation facilities for South Skye. The SCIO has successfully been formed and is working with partners including The Highland Council, The Scottish Government and the Skye and Lochalsh Housing Association and national funders to work towards improved facilities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The trustees have considered the need to hold free reserves (being unrestricted funds not held as assets or for a designated purpose or otherwise committed) and actively monitor their financial position. With reference to the Statement of Balances, free reserves at 30 November 2024 was £Nil. The trustees acknowledge this position and intend to generating unrestricted income after the period end

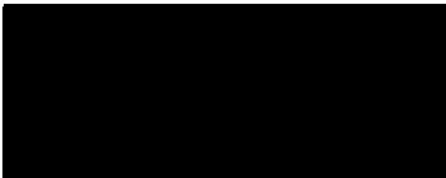

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of South Skye Community Campus


Basis of independent examiner's statement
