Type of governing document

Constitution

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The charity trustees are those who initially supported the application to establish the charity and any others who are invited and appointed by the existing charity trustees. All charity trustees shall remain in office until the appointment is terminated in accordance with the terms of Clause 24 of the charity constitution.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The advancement of religion, specifically the Christian faith, primarily within Scotland and elsewhere by promoting and sustaining the development of new church initiatives to function consistent with the Christian Bible and the Statement of Faith of the charity as appended to the constitution.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

1. Identification of opportunities to establish new churches for the benefit of local communities
2. Supporting individual church planters in commencing the work of church planting in those areas
3. Connecting with pastors interested in church planting
4. Promoting church planting at relevant events
5. Engaging with other church planting organisations
6. Partnering with churches looking to support new church plants
7. Supporting new church plants with resources

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

During this reporting period, The Story Churches Network continued to advance its charitable purpose of promoting the Christian faith, supporting local communities, and developing leaders for mission and church planting across Scotland.

The network carried out a range of spiritual, educational, and community-based activities, including:
Worship and Discipleship: A total of 71 church services and 23 study group meetings were held in our Glasgow location, providing regular opportunities for worship, teaching, and fellowship.

Community Engagement: The Story Churches Network participated in five community events in partnership with Helenslea Community Centre, serving local residents and strengthening community relationships.

Mission and Outreach: Two sports camps were organised, reaching approximately 100 children with positive activities and faith-based engagement. In addition, six short-term mission teams visited Glasgow to support local outreach initiatives, and one mission trip was undertaken by members of the network to serve in another region.

Church Planting and Leadership Training: The network supported the training of 14 church planting leaders through its M4 partnership and related mentoring initiatives. An important milestone for the charity is the full-time employment of the charity founder to manage the training, organising, marketing and day to day tasks to deliver the purpose of the charity. Following this appointment, the charity has been able to grow the amount and efficiency of training and results from its activities.

Compassion and Social Action: A new partnership was developed with the Glasgow Northeast Foodbank to provide food and practical assistance to individuals and families experiencing hardship. Through these activities, The Story Churches Network continued to build relationships, strengthen local mission, and contribute positively to the spiritual and social wellbeing of the communities it serves.

It is the policy of the trustees to deploy any funds secured to advance the activities of the charity rather than to build reserves, subject to retaining a reasonable working capital balance for the conduct of the operations.

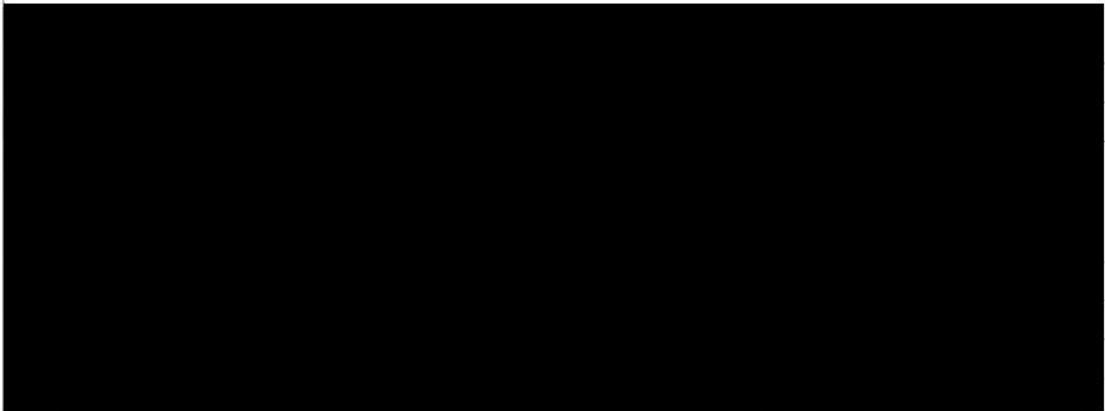
