## Activities

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**Activities:** 'It carries out activities or services itself'

**Purposes:** 'the advancement of education', 'the advancement of the arts, heritage, culture or science'

**What the charity does:** Our charity is set up to support Ukrainian children and young people aged 5 to 18 by providing education, care and stability in a safe and welcoming environment. We teach Ukrainian language, history, culture and heritage, alongside core subjects such as mathematics, English and business studies, and we also help children develop social skills, confidence and a sense of belonging. We do this through weekly classes, extra-curricular activities, creative projects and opportunities to learn about both Ukrainian and Scottish culture. We also support the children emotionally as they adjust to life in Scotland after the war in Ukraine. In addition, we organise charitable activities, fundraising and community events so the children can give back, build friendships and grow in confidence while making a positive contribution to their local community.

**Beneficiaries:** 'Children or young people'

**Objectives:** The organisation's purposes are: The SCIO shall be established for charitable purposes only and the objects for which the SCIO is established shall be to advance both education and culture by supporting the development of the Ukrainian language and culture in Scotland by (a) educating children, young people from 5 to 18 in the Ukrainian language and culture. (b) recruiting, training and managing volunteers and paid staff for the purposes of education of children and young people. (c) providing facilities for the purposes of education and meeting. and (d) provide learning and development opportunities through the Ukrainian language and English language. and national and regional challenges and adversity.

## **Structure, Governance and Management Constitution**

The charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO) registered in its legal form on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2024 as SC053287.

### **Appointment and Responsibilities of the Trustees**

The charity is governed by a Board of Trustees. The minimum number of trustees is three and the maximum is eight. The Board may appoint any person to be a trustee by resolution passed by a majority vote at a Board meeting. The Board has eight trustees following the appointment of Karina Kutuzova and Kateryna Holovko as parent trustees during the year, and two co-opted advisers: the Director of Education and the Secretary.

Kirsten Kooy stood down as Trustee at the end of December 2025 and was replaced by John Kirk. Marjan Pokhylyy has confirmed he will stand down as Trustee at this AGM and the Board has approved the appointment of Lady Coulsfield to replace him. The Board is very grateful to Kirsten and Marjan for all their efforts as Trustees and supporters of the charity and the School, from its creation to the present day.

The charity ran continuously throughout 2025 and was administered through a monthly meeting every month of the year during term times. Full records of the monthly meetings are taken by the Secretary and circulated to the trustees and approved at the next monthly meeting. Likewise, the budget was set and approved monthly by the trustees.

The main responsibilities of the Board are to ensure good governance of the School, safeguarding, fund-raising, and the administration of the finances.

### **Objectives of the School**

1. To teach Ukrainian children and students, from ages 5 years to 18 years, Ukrainian language, customs, art, history, and heritage.
2. To teach core academic subjects such as mathematics, the English language, and business studies.
3. To promote social skills, which will help our students to integrate successfully within their local community and to foster confidence when working within groups, notably the primary school children.
4. To provide extra-curricular activities to gain a wider perspective of Ukrainian and Scottish culture, as well as having fun together, which helps to forge lasting relationships.
5. To help the children and students cope with the emotion of being refugees from war-torn Ukraine.

## **Achievement & Performance: Highlights of 2025**

**January 25 to June 25:** We completed the School's Second Year in June 2025 with a prize giving ceremony at St John's Episcopal Church when prizes were awarded to 30 children for achievement and attendance. The 100 supporters and parents were entertained by the children and teenagers performing singing, poetry, and dancing.

**Appreciation:** We are very grateful to George Heriot's School who allowed us to use classrooms free of charge for a second year until June 2025. We were also grateful that St Cuthbert's Parish Church and St John's allowed us to use their room facilities on the occasions when George Heriot's classrooms were unavailable.

**Major Change:** The major change of 2025 came in August, when the teachers decided to run the School for four hours every Saturday during term time, instead of two and a half hours, and start at the later time of 10.30am instead of 9am because several children and teachers travel from Glasgow, Fife, Eyemouth, and the Borders. In consequence we used five churches for our weekly meetings in the autumn of 2025; in addition, to the two churches mentioned earlier, we are grateful to Greyfriars Kirk, St Stephen's Comely Bank, and Barclay Viewforth Church for rooms and facilities.

**August to December 2025:** The "new school day" resulted in twelve new children joining the School and we have had over 30 attending regularly every week, whatever the weather and wherever the location! We have a large 15/16-year-old group who have grown in confidence in their studies and have matured in character. The younger children too have enjoyed the company of one another, and all the children have progressed in the Ukrainian language, history, art, dance, mathematics, English language, and social skills.

**Accreditation:** Our School has been verified by the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine on 29 September 2025. This means that learning results are recognised by Ukrainian schools without additional assessment or loss of the academic year. Teachers in verified schools can also have their teaching experience officially recognised.

**Extra-Curricular Activities:** Throughout 2025 we increased the frequency of the extra-curricular activities thanks to National Lottery funding, together with donations from John Watson's Trust and Mission of Innocents. The activities included four museum visits, a castle visit, games, art, dancing, story-telling, first aid, and the beach trip to North Berwick via the train. The latter was a very special and fun day for the Ukrainian families.

**Charitable Activities:** The children and parents have supported other charitable activities in the local community including a visit to the Braeburn Care Home where they sang songs and recited poems, and participated in the "Shoebox Appeal 2025" Christmas initiative.

**Fund Raising:** We raise funds to pay the Ukrainian teachers for their contributions and meet expenses – mainly snacks for the children, room hire and travel costs for two teachers. In 2025 we raised £23,517 thanks to the generosity of the National Lottery, the Edinburgh

Trades Fund, six super donors, private donations, donations from two private schools and two other charities, and parental contributions.

The outstanding commitment of the eight Ukrainian teachers, and the conscientious support from six English language teachers has ensured that the children not only receive high standards of teaching in a fun atmosphere but also hope for the future.

**Future Plans:** The School has sufficient funds to continue to the end of the third school year in June 2026. A decision will have to be made shortly to decide if the School should continue for a fourth year starting in August 2026. This will be dependent upon the number of teachers remaining in Scotland, the likely size of the student intake, and whether the trustees think they can raise sufficient funds.

Sadly, the war in Ukraine is not over, and some of our families have no homes to go back to. We pray for better days ahead for the Ukrainian nation and everyone that our School supports.

### **Safeguarding**

Safeguarding has been organised by one of the trustees, a former Human Resources Director, and a trained safeguarding supervisor and administrator for St Cuthbert's Church. Her expertise ensured that a safeguarding policy was put in place and all safeguarding requirements were met by all the teachers. Karina Kutuzova, one of our parent Trustees, has taken over as Safeguarding Administrator. Hanna Tekliuk remains in her role as Safeguarding Supervisor.

Likewise, the trustees, who are in regular contact with the children have all undertaken the essential safeguarding training and are Protecting Vulnerable Groups (PVG) scheme registered.

### **Appreciation**

The Ukrainian teachers led by the Director of Education, assisted by the Scottish teachers, have worked tirelessly to provide the teaching support to the Ukrainian children.

The people and organisations, churches and schools of Edinburgh and West Lothian have supported this charity generously because of their concern for Ukraine and its children resident in Scotland through making financial donations and giving their time.

We thank in particular the Ukrainian Teachers throughout the year: Hanna Tekliuk, Nataliia Shulpina, Malvina Kustro, Valentyna Yanchevska, Taisiia Taranovska, Liudmyla Bubniv, Inna Maksymenko (retired June 2025), Anna Povazhna, and Oksana Sayapina. Likewise, we thank the English Language volunteer teachers for giving their time to the Ukrainian children; namely Sandy Frost, Matt Hosgood, Dr Alison Niven, Elaine Ford, Faith Sutherland, and Irene Richardson.

We are thankful to the five churches who provide accommodation for the Saturday School without whose support we could not function in the way that we do. The five churches are St Cuthbert's Parish Church, St John's Episcopal Church, Greyfriars Kirk, St Stephen's Comely Bank, and Barclay Viewforth Church.

We also give thanks to the parents for their donations, their energy in helping their children get to and from school, and for those who have been able to help at activities and in preparing snacks.

#### **Financial review**

These accounts cover the activities of the charity for the year from 1 January 2025 to 31 December 2025. These are the second set of accounts prepared; the first set which were presented at the AGM on 29 March 2025 covered the 17-month period from the start of the school in August 2023 to 31 December 2024.

#### **Reserves**

The trustees' practice is to generate and retain enough funds to ensure that the charity can meet its commitments. Funds need to be available to meet operating expenses, which mainly consist of payments to Ukrainian teachers for classes, snacks for the children, room hire, and for extracurricular activities.

Cash held in the bank on 31 December 2025 of £12,642 is considered sufficient together with known additional donations and gift aid receipts in January 2026, and likely future parental contributions, to operate the school until at least the end of the current school year (30 June 2026).

Payments are made to Ukrainian teachers for delivering classes and extracurricular activities (where appropriate). Other (UK national) teachers provide their time without payment.

We provide breaktime snacks for the children to maintain their energy and enthusiasm. We are very thankful to the parents who help with preparation.

Following the move to a longer school day after summer 2025 the School uses rooms and sanctuary spaces in various city centre churches for classes. We are very grateful to the churches involved for the access provided and make a small payment each week for the use of their facilities.

An allowance for travel costs is made to Ukrainian teachers who travel significant distances to assist in the Saturday school.

Extracurricular activities are often provided where we visit museums and places of interest, or where the activities take place in the Saturday school premises. We incur costs for teacher supervisors, travel, refreshments, and materials for off-site activities, as well as prizes.

### **Independent Examiner's Report**

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the **Ukrainian St Margaret's Saturday School (SCIO)**.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025 which are set out on pages 9 to 11.

#### ***Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner***

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### ***Basis of independent examiner's statement***

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters.
