Activities: 'It carries out activities or services itself'

Purposes: 'the provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended', 'the advancement of environmental protection or improvement'

What the charity does: Socialtrack is set up to support children, young people, and communities through inclusive, wheeled sport, and outdoor activity that improves wellbeing, confidence, skills, and community connection, particularly in areas affected by inequality and limited access to opportunities. The charity uses accessible cycling and wheeled sport activities, informal education, and youth-led engagement as tools to reduce barriers to participation, support personal development, and strengthen local communities. Programmes are designed in collaboration with young people, families, schools, and local partners to ensure they respond to real local need. Socialtrack delivers its work through free to participant sessions, community events, partnerships with local organisations, and volunteer involvement. Alongside direct activity, the charity prioritises consultation, learning, and evaluation to ensure its work is safe, inclusive, and able to demonstrate positive impact over time.

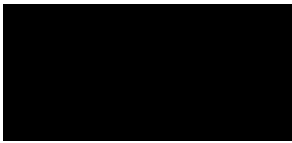

The charity was governed by the following trustees during the reporting period:



The trustees are responsible for the governance and strategic direction of the charity and for ensuring that it operates in line with its charitable purposes and applicable regulatory requirements.

Charitable purposes

Socialtrack was established for,

The provision of recreational facilities or the organisation of recreational activities with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended.

The advancement of environmental protection or improvement.

The charity's purposes are intended to, but not limited to, primarily benefit community members living in North Lanarkshire, Scotland.

Activities and achievements during the year

Key activities included:

- Completing charity registration and establishing governance structures
- Developing core organisational policies and procedures
- Trustee meetings to set strategic direction and clarify charitable purposes
- Volunteer involvement and observation at community cycling and action sports events delivered by partner organisations, supporting skills development and learning

- Engagement with local community networks, boards, and partners to understand local need and identify future opportunities
- Early consultation with young people, families, and community partners to inform programme design

While no direct charitable expenditure or income occurred during this period, these preparatory activities were essential to ensure the charity was appropriately governed, compliant, and ready to begin delivery in the following year.

Financial review

There were no financial transactions during the reporting period.

- The charity received no income
- The charity incurred no expenditure
- No funds were held or spent on charitable activities
- The charity's bank account remained dormant throughout the year

As a result, no receipts and payments account has been prepared for this period.

Plans for future periods

In the next reporting period the charity plans to move from organisational setup into active delivery of charitable activities.

Key plans include:

- Delivering inclusive, cycling/wheeled sport-based programmes for children and young people, particularly in communities experiencing inequality
- Working in partnership with schools, community organisations, and local services to deliver targeted and open-access sessions
- Continuing volunteer recruitment, training, and development to support safe and effective delivery
- Ongoing consultation with young people, families, and community partners to shape programmes and ensure they respond to local need
- Securing grant funding and other charitable income to support programme delivery, equipment, and staffing
- Developing systems to monitor participation, outcomes, and impact to support learning, accountability, and future funding applications

The trustees will continue to review the charity's activities, governance, and financial position to ensure the organisation remains sustainable, compliant, and focused on delivering public benefit.
