Knitting Commissions and Facebook:

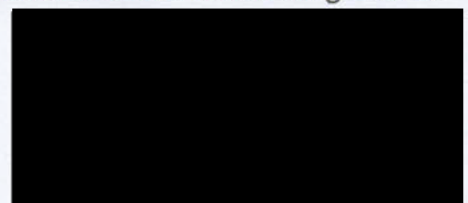
