What the charity does: We are a non-profit community initiative, committed to hiring e-bikes to Hawick folk and visitors to the town. Our main aims are to improve health and wellbeing, whilst maximising the use of our new Active Travel Network and allowing more people to enjoy the beautiful countryside around Hawick. We do this by: 1. Securing funding to allow free Ebike hire 2. Offering cycle led rides, allowing people to enjoy fresh air and meet new people 3. Offering opportunities for one to one tuition and guidance 4. Working together with companies to offer free Ebike hire allowing staff to commute to work 5. Offering interested parties opportunity to gain cycle maintenance certificates and support led rides 6. Engaging with youth and other groups to provide cycle maintenance classes 7. Offering Free ebike hire and guidance to trial Ebikes

Three original trustees continue to identify interested members of the community to become trustees. It is our goal to encourage further growth in the next year.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

We are a non-profit community initiative, committed to hiring e-bikes to Hawick folk and visitors to the town.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Our main aims are to improve health and wellbeing, whilst maximising the use of our new Active Travel Network and allowing more people to enjoy the beautiful countryside around Hawick.

We aim to:

1. Reduce the number of local car journeys, saving users money and reducing carbon footprint
2. Improving users overall health and wellbeing.
3. Provide support to new cyclists and those who want to rebuild their cycling skills.
4. Offer greener travel and community cycling as an alternative leisure activity
5. Provide opportunities for volunteering for example customer service skills and cycle maintenance, support cycle led rides
6. Provide opportunities to learn cycle maintenance and repair for all
7. Opportunities to trial e-bikes prior to making a financial commitment, including signposting to Cycle to Work Schemes

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Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Cycle led rides have proven popular with a core group of cyclists.

Teri Bikes main success has been funding from SEStran to provide the opportunity of 'free' e-bike hire. This has made cycling more accessible to local people.

From December 2024 to June 2025, we have had

- o 109 weekly hires and 41 daily hires
- o 954 total cycling hours
- o 3603 total cycling miles

This year we have noticed a steady increase in bike repairs and servicing.

The Hub is managed by the Trustees and two volunteers, providing around 20 hours per week alongside a 12 hour per week paid hub manager / cycle mechanic

One volunteer has completed his Velotech Bronze and Silver Cycle Maintenance award.

The trustees continue to apply for funding to maintain both the cycle hub and employment of the hub manager. They also offer the hub and its facilities and bikes to community partners.

The Hub manager has supported pupils at the local High School and youth groups.
