Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Trustees are appointed by the board by way of a resolution passed by majority vote at a board meeting. At each AGM one third of trustees, either the longest serving or by random ballot, retire but can stand for re-election if they choose.

Organisational Structure

Office bearers - The Chair, Treasurer and Secretary are appointed from within the Trustees and serve for a term of a year. The trustees meet every four months.

Activities

This has been a busy first year, which started by taking part in an exhibition in London and finished by participating in one local to St Andrews. In between we have taken up opportunities to take part in exhibitions, performances and socially engaged projects in both England and Scotland, and to organise and curate an exhibition in the St Andrews Reflective Garden on the theme of Nurturing Hope

The varied programme of contemporary art has been on display at the Telos Box in St Andrews which has displayed work from local and international artists and following a collaboration with DJCAD one of their students. The year ended with Revelation Arts offering a collaborative poetry workshop for the St Andrews International Poetry Festival

We have and will continue to support our Creative Director, in her practice based PhD research exploring the way in which listening as a creative practice can hold open a space for reimagining a more ideal reality.

We have continued to benefit from the advice of the Accelerate Programme regarding our policies and business plan and more recently our digital media strategy which has been invaluable. We have now established a website presence and designed logos for both Revelation Arts and Telos Box so our brand is recognisable. We will be implementing their recommendations throughout next year.

We end the year having established good working relationships with local artists, other arts organisations, and local universities. We have also taken up opportunities to reach out to other communities further afield, and so look forward to an exciting year ahead.

Financial Review

We are in a healthy financial position, with sufficient funds for the next year and beyond. This has been achieved partly by our trustees being frugal with our funds and not claiming allowable expenses, and giving much in kind support for which we are grateful

Reserves Policy

We agreed in July 2025 to hold at least 3 months operating costs (currently £4,000 in an instant access reserve account. The balance in this account is currently in excess of £16,000



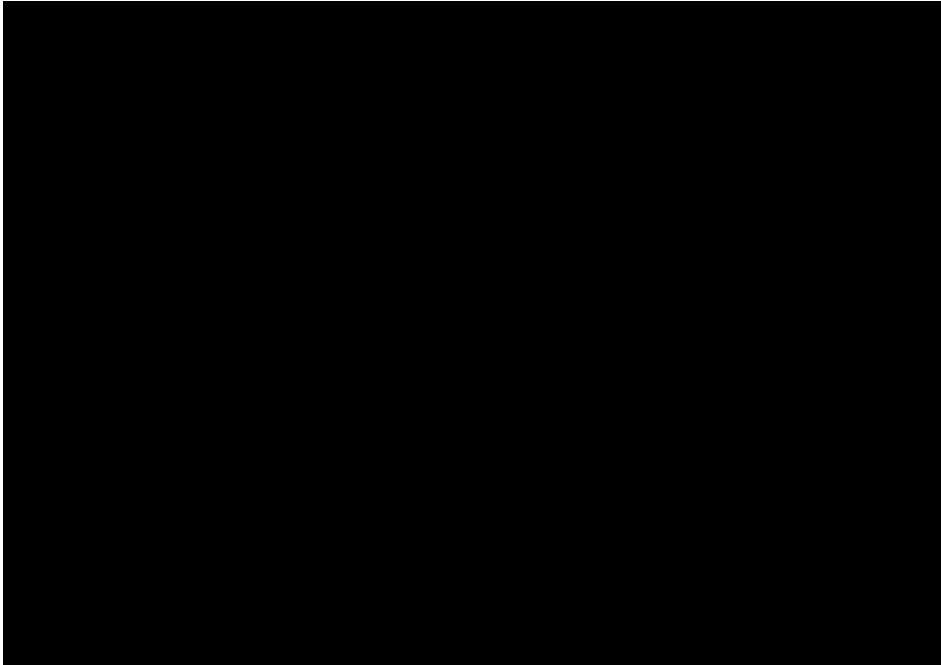

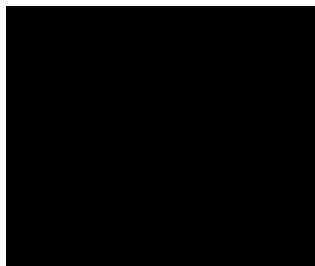

We don't currently have any funds. We are investigating different ways of resourcing the charity

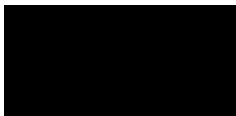

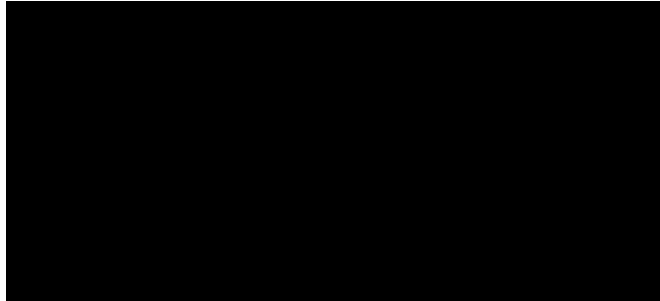

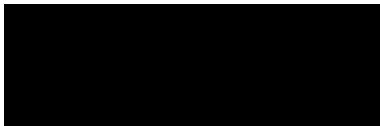
